Note: **Garbage** and **trash** will be picked up at your unit on Tuesday and Friday.

I. THE RECYCLE BINS/CONTAINERS ARE BLUE

the North end of Banyan Blvd. by Quonset 4

- a) the South end of Banyan Blvd. between the Town Hall and bath house
- b) large blue bins are also between Quonsets 3 & 4

In the **LARGE BLUE BINS** deposit:

- i. Glass bottles and jars. Caps removed.
- ii. Just about all plastic containers (jugs, meat and fruit). Anything with a “recycle triangle”. Look on the bottom of objects. Here is an example: 
- iii. Milk and juice cartons.
- iv. Drink boxes. Caps and straws removed.

In the **SMALL BLUE CONTAINERS** deposit:

- v. Aluminum cans
(These bins are processed by the Boating and Fishing club and proceeds support the club.)

II. MONDAY COLLECTIONS

At your unit each Monday morning, volunteers from the Boating and Fishing Club will collect these items you set out:

- Newspapers, magazines, catalogs and telephone books. It’s preferred that you use brown paper bags to store these in and not plastic bags.
- Aluminum cans
- Flattened corrugated cardboard

Please note that our volunteers are spending their mornings collecting these items. It makes their day much brighter if you use brown paper bags to place the paper products in and if you flattened corrugated boxes. Also note that they do **not** collect plastic products.

III. TIPS

- *Plastic bags. Become “greener” and return these to the grocer.
- **If you have a question whether a can is aluminum or not, see if a magnet sticks to it. A magnet will “not” stick to aluminum.
- Medical waste: should be properly disposed of. Many people will put syringes for example in a plastic bottle and take it to a pharmacy or their doctor’s office for final disposal.
